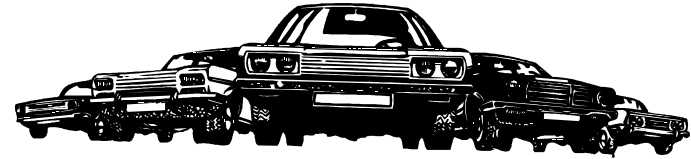

Memorial Day

President Lyndon Johnson signed a law likely to cut church attendance. The measure - which won rare unanimous support from the National Chamber of Commerce, the AFL-CIO, and the, and the US Commerce Department - move four federal holidays to Monday.

Beginning January 1, 1971, new three-day weekends will annually be held for these holidays: Washington's birthday (third Monday in February), Memorial Day (last Monday in May), Columbus Day (second Monday in October), and Veterans Day (fourth Monday in October).

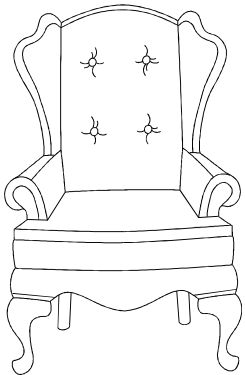
The changes will increase weekend travel and, as a result, church absenteeism.



Maclaren's One Hour

Dr. Alexander Maclaren was one of the clearest Bible Expositors of the age. One of his assistants once asked him what had contributed most of all to his success.

Dr. Maclaren - after deprecating the idea that he had attained "success" - said that he owed all that was in himself and his ministry to the habit, never broken, of spending one hour a day "alone with the Eternal." The hour which he took was from nine to ten in the morning.



His assistant says that he was sometimes allowed to be in the room with the pastor, but no word was allowed. In his well-worn armchair he sat, with his big Bible on his knees, sometimes reading its pages, more frequently his hand over his face.

During that hour he did not allow himself to read even the Bible for texts, or as a student. It was read as a child would read a letter from an absent father; as a loving heart would drink in again the message from a loved one far away.
