Amazing Science in the King James Bible

41. Dietary Restrictions

(Leviticus 11:13-19) - 1451 BC

The Bible warns against eating birds of prey. Scientists now recognize that those birds eat carrion (putrefying flesh), often spread disease.

42. More Dietary Restrictions

(Deuteronomy 14:8) - 1491 BC

Not so long ago, science learned that eating undercooked pork causes and infection of parasites called trichinosis. Now consider this: the Bible forbade the eating of swine more than 3,000 years before we learned how to cook pork safely.

A maker of violins searched all his life for wood that would serve for making violins with a certain beautiful and haunting resonance. At last he succeeded when he came into possession of wood gathered from the timberline, the last stand of trees of the Rockies, 12,000 feet above sea level. Up there where the winds blow so fiercely and steadily that the bark to windward has no chance to grow, where the branches all point one way, and where a tree to live must stay on its knees all through its life, that is where the world's most resonant wood for violins is born and lives and dies.
